of said Province of their goods and Chattells Land and tenements Doyntly and
Severally to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors to be made and levied
If it happen that the said William King do not pay unto his said Lordship or his
agent and factor fifty shillings Curr. Money of Maryland for every year he shall keep
such Ordinary or house of Entertainment as aforesaid.

Likewise the said William King with the aforesaid King and Wm. Mawbey
his Servtys and all present here in Court in their proper persons as aforesaid acknowledged
themselves indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in forty pounds Curr. money
of Maryland aforesaid of their goods and Chattells Land and tenements Doyntly and Severally
to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors to be made and levied. If it
happen that the said William King do not keep good rules and Orders and do suffer
Idle loose or disorderly persons to tipple game or committ disorder or other dis-
orderly in his Ordinary or house of Entertainment during the time that he shall keep the
same Contrary to the true intent and meaning of the act of assembly in such case made
and provided by

to keep an Ordinary or house of Entertainment at his house at Prince Ann town

unto him granted he giving good security according to act of assembly in such case provided
for. Whereupon the said Henry Reynolds with James Alderson & Richard Knight of
Somerset County planters his blemfys etc present here in Court in their proper persons
acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary of the pro-
vince of Maryland in five pounds Curr. Money of said Province of their goods and Chattells
Land and tenements Doyntly and Severally to the use of his said Lordship his
heirs
