Ordered to give new Recognizance for her appearance at June Court Next to answer the Judgment & premises of her . . . Thereupon the said Elizabeth Smith with legal King her Security both present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in five pounds Court Money of Maryland each of their severall goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements to the Use of his said Lordship his heirs & Assigns to be made & Seized If it happen that the said Eliz. Smith do not make her personal appearance before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be hold at Dividing Creek in the said County the third Tuesday of June the next following to answer unto his said Lordship of and concerning the Judgment and premises of her and do not stand & abide the Judgment ^{of the Court} thereof, and do depart the same Court without leave . . .

All which day was the said Elizabeth Smith altho' solemnly called come not according to the tenor of the Recognizance ^{of} nor shows cause why & the said legal King altho' at the same day being solemnly called brings not in the said Eliz. Smith according to the Recognizance of her but makes default &
