

Hereupon or Render his body in Execution of such Judgment to the prison of the Sheriff of the County
where he shall remain until the same Judgment should be fully satisfied or that he the said John Bowen
will do the same for him &c. And the aforesaid Charles Rankliffe by Francis Allen his attorney
comes and defends the force and Injury when &c. and saith that he cannot deny the action of the
aforesaid Duncan nor but that he did assume upon himself in manner and form as the said Duncan
above against him hath complained and as to the damage of the same Duncan by him by occasion
of the premises in that part sustained the same Charles saith and acknowledgeth that the said Duncan
hath sustained damages by occasion of the premises beyond his Costs and Charges by him about his
Suit in that part appoyed to five pounds nineteen Shillings and nine pence Curr^t money of Mary-
land and not more and because the said Duncan denyes not this but the same allegation believes
to be true prayes Judgment for those damages above acknowledged together with his Costs and Charges
to be done to him to be adjudged &c.

Therefore by Consent of the parties it is considered that the said Duncan Money-
reover against the aforesaid Charles Rankliffe his damages to the said five pounds Nineteen
Shillings and nine pence Curr^t Money of Maryland by the same Charles Rankliffe in form as above
acknowledged as also.
