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any part thereof unto the same Whittington have not paid nor hath either of them paid but that unto him to pay the afo. Benjamin in his lifetime and the afo. Casell after the death of the said Benj. to pay still still doth refuse and unjustly detain to the damage of the same Whittington seven thousand and pounds of tobacco and fourteen pounds Curr. money and thereof he bringeth suit &c. Pledges &c. John Doe & Richard Roe

A copy of the foregoing declaration was made and sent to be served on the afo. with the writt aforesaid according to act of assembly in such case provided - At which day here before his Lordships Justices at a Court then held at deviding Creek came the afo. Whittington King by his attorney afo. and the Sheriff of Somerset County to wit John Henry Gent. now here returned that he had taken the afo. Casell King whose body hereat this day he had ready to answer the afo. Whittington King of the afo. plea as to him it was commanded. and further the same Sheriff returned that he had served the same Casell King with a copy of the declaration afo. according to act of assembly in such case provided &c.

And the afo. Casell King by George Douglas his attorney Cometh and defendeth the force and injury when &c. and prayeth leave thereof to Imparke here untill the next Court to be held at deviding Creek in and for the County afo. the third Tuesday of March then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the afo. Whittington here also &c.

At which day here came againe as well the afo. Whittington as the afo. Casell by their attorneys afo. and whereupon the same Casell prayeth further leave thereof to Imparke here untill the next Court to be held at deviding Creek in and for the County afo. the third Tuesday of June then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the afo. Whittington here also &c.

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
