All which day here came againe as welle the aff Isaac Bredell as the aff William Gray by their attorney, aforesaid and whereupon the same ~~Isaiah~~ as before deposed the jury saying wherof and forays an hearing of the writing obligatory and it is read to him in these words The condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounded William Gray his ^{heirs} Executors administrators or assigns shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid to the above named Isaac Bredell his heirs Executors or administrators the sum of thirty six pounds of bill of credit of the said province of aforesaid on demand without fraud or further delay then this obligation to be void and of none effect or else to stand and remain in full force and vertue which being read and heard the said William Gray that the said Isaac his action aforesaid against him to have and maintain ought not because he says that he the said William on the twenty eighth day of June Anno Domini seventeen hundred thirty and four at Somerset County aforesaid did pay to the said Isaac the said sum of thirty six pounds current money of Maryland in the condition aforesaid mentioned according to the force form and effect of the said condition and this he is ready to verify Wherefore he prays Judgment if the said Isaac, his action aforesaid against him the said William to have and maintain ought &c. Wherupon the aff William Balmgwick with his verification aforesaid by him above pretended, saith that he cannot deny the action aforesaid of the aff Isaac nor but that the writing obligatory aforesaid is his deed, nor but that he oweth the same Isaac the aff Seventy pounds Lawfull current money of Maryland in manner and form as the aff Isaac first above against him declared -- Therefore it is considered that the aff Isaac Bredell recover against the aff William

Gray his debt aforesaid and his damages by occasion of the detention of that same debt to Court here adjudged and the aff William to pay ^{pounds of tobacco to the same Isaac of his spent by the} with stay of execution until the first day of June then next following.
