that he had taken the afo Mathew Kemp whose body here at this day he had ready to an-
swer unto the afo Foster of the afo Plea as to him it was commanded
Whereupon the afo Mathew Kemp in his proper person Cometh and defendeth the
force and Injury wherein &c And thereupon the said Foster Cunliffe then and there his
writt afo against the afo Mathew Kemp did not prosecute with Effect but volunt-
arily suffered his Suit to be discontinued &c Therefore it is considered that
the afo Foster Cunliffe take nothing by his writt afo but be in mercy for his false clamour
and that the afo Mathew Kemp go a free man without day &c
