One man^d was given to the Coroners of Somerset County that he should take Joseph Manester late of Somerset County Gent. Otherwise called Joseph Manester of Somerset County Gent. if he should be found in their baileywick and sum should safe keep so that they might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held in the Court house at Dividing Creek in the same County the third Tuesday of November and that One thousand seven hundred and thirty six to answer unto Richard Gildart Esq^r of a debt that he tender unto him the sum of four thousand two hundred thirty & three pounds of good sound merchantable leaf tobacco and cask which unto him heareth and was justly demanded by and that none of them should not fail for ---

All which day came before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset County held at Dividing Creek in and for the same County. Came the afo^d Richard Gildart by Willm^m Goldborough his attorney and the Coroners of the same County who returned that they had taken the afo^d Joseph Manester whose body was at that day they have had ready to answer the afo^d Richard Gildart of the afo^d plea as to whom it was commanded. Whereupon afterani William Beringham and George Douglas of Somerset County Gent. came here before his Lordship, Justices at Dividing Creek afo^d, in their proper persons and undertook to pay to the afo^d Joseph M^r Lester and assumed upon themselves (likewise the same Joseph Manester present herein Court in his proper person assumed upon himself) that if it should happen that Judgment in the plea afo^d in the same Court, should be rendered for the same Richard Gildart against him the said Joseph Manester, or that the said Joseph M^r Lester should be thereby convicted, that then he the said Joseph M^r Lester should pay and satisfy unto the said Richard Gildart the Judgment of the Court hereupon or tender his body in execution of such Judgment to the prison of the County of that there to remain until the same Judgment fully satisfied, unto the same Richard or that they the same William Beringham and George Douglas will do the same for him.

And Whereupon the same Joseph M^r Lester publishing place William Beringham against against the afo^d Richard Gildart of the plea afo^d and upon this day is given to the parties herebefore the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset until the third Tuesday of March then next following in the state wherein they now are ^{to the party afo^d} At which day here come again as well the afo^d Richard Gildart as the afo^d Joseph M^r Lester by their attorneys afo^d and whereupon the same Richard Gildart declared against the said Joseph M^r Lester in the plea afo^d in form following
