should not fail &c At which day here before the Justices of the Lordships County Court of
Somerset at Bridgwater came the aforesaid Richard Gildart by William Goldsbrough his attorney
and the Coroners of the same County here returned that they had taken the aforesaid Joseph Maulester whose
body here at this day they have ready to answer the aforesaid Richard Gildart of the aforesaid plea as to them
it was commanded & Whereupon a certain William Beckingham and George Douglas of Somers-
et County gentle in their proper persons before the said Justices and undertook and each of them under-
took for the same Joseph Maulester and affirmed upon themselves (Likewise the same Joseph
Maulester present here in Court in his proper person affirmed upon himself) that if it should happen that
Judgment in the plea aforesaid in the same court should be rendered for the same Richard Gildart
against him the said Joseph McClester or that he the said Joseph McClester should be
therein convicted that then he the said Joseph McClester should pay and satisfy unto the
said Richard Gildart the Judgment of the Court thereupon or render his body in Execution
of such Judgment to the prison of the County aforesaid thereto remain until the same Judgment
be fully satisfied unto the same Richard or that they the same William Beckingham &
Geo: Douglas will do the same for him.

And Whereupon the same Joseph McClester puts in his place William Beckingham,^{gent}
against the aforesaid Richard Gildart of the plea aforesaid and upon this day is given to the parties here
before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset until the third Tuesday of March
then next following in the State wherein they now are ^{the parties of} saving to it. At which day here
came againe as well the aforesaid Richard Gildart as the aforesaid Joseph McClester by their
attorneys aforesaid and hereupon the same Richard Gildart declared against the said
Joseph McClester in the plea aforesaid in sum following Somerset County vs Joseph
McClester late of Somerset County gent: was attacted to answer unto Richard Gildart Esq:

And Whereupon the same Richard by William Goldsbrough his attorney complain-
eth that whereas a certain William Beckingham the eighteenth day of February in the
year of our Lord God seventeen hundred thirty and five at Somerset County aforesaid (the same William
Beckingham then and there negotiating and concreting his certain bill in writing
according to the use and custom of Merchants from time whereof the memory of man is not
to the contrary used and approved did make and with his proper hand subscribe bearing date
