the time of the said division therewas some conversation between the said Edward Beachamp and  
Edward Hull in relation to a former agreement but they differed upon the terms of the said former  
agreement and further this deponent saith not.

His Ladyship Memorandum that upon the 27<sup>th</sup> day of Decemb<sup>r</sup>. Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> 1736 came before me the  
francis Tale subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of the peace for Somerset County Francis

Tale and Heber Whittingham and did acknowledge themselves to owe and stand indebted  
unto the Right Honourable the Lord P<sup>r</sup> in the sum of ten pounds sterl each to be paid unto his said  
Lordship his heirs and successors.

The Condition of the above Recouurance is such that if the above bound Francis Tale shall  
make his personal appearance at March Court next and not depart the same Court without leave  
thereof and in the mean time to be of good behaviour to all his Lordships good people but more especi-  
ally to Terence Gallaspie then this Recouurance to be void and of none effect or else to be and remain  
in full force power and Virtue taken before —

Now whereas this day to wit the fifteenth day of March Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety  
Eight I came here into Court the aforesaid Francis Tale in his proper person according to the Recouurance aforesaid and pray  
that his appearance be and his security discharged &c. Whereupon the said Francis Tales appearance is tended  
and he and his security accordingly discharged &c. Whereupon the said Francis Tale is ordered by the Court here  
to give security for the payment of the several Officers their fee due upon the Recouurance aforesaid whereupon  
one a certain Heber Whittingham of Somerset County hath presented himself in Court undertook for the said Francis  
Tale to pay the several Officers their fee or fees due by means of the Recouurance aforesaid In case the said  
Francis Tale doth not pay the same etc.

We the subscribers pursuant to an order of Somer-  
set County Court dated the 18<sup>th</sup> day November 1735 have laid out a bridle path for Robert Harris from  
his dwelling plantation in parish hawkins neck to his upper plantation at the head of parish hawkins  
neck by the side of a great swamp leavir high ground opposite to the plantation of John  
Denstons and John Phillips given under our hands the Day of Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> 1735
