unto the Right Honourable the Lord p^r in the sum of ten pounds ster^l each to be paid unto his said
Lordship his heirs and Successors

The Condition of the above Recognizance is such that if the above bound Francis Tale shall
make his personal appearance at March Court next and not depart the same Court without leave
thereof and in the mean time to be of good behaviour to all his Lordships good people but more especi-
ally to Lawrence Gallaspie then this Recognizance to be void and of none effect or else to be and Remain
in full force power and Virtue taken before
