George Smith late of Somerset County planter came here into Court in his proper person according to a certain Writ of attachment against him for his not appearing before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset he being Legally Summoned thereto for not burning of tobacco according to act of Assembly in such case made and provided and forasmuch as the said George Smith hath nothing to Object that was Materal but was willing to pay his fine for the same &c. Therefore it is Considered by the Court here that the afo George Smith be sued to his Lordship for and by Cuation of the premises aff twenty Shillings curr. money of Maryland &c.

Richard Carey late of Somerset County planter came here into Court in his proper person according to a certain Writ of attachment against him for his not burning of tobacco according to act of Assembly in such case made and provided, and forasmuch as the said Richard Carey hath nothing to Object that was Materal but was willing to pay his fine for the same &c. Therefore it is Considered by the Court here that the afo Richard Carey be sued to his Lordship for and by Cuation of the premises aff twenty Shillings curr. money of Maryland &c whereupon the said Richard Carey is ordered to give Security for the payment of the several Officers their fees due by means of the premises aff Whereupon Littleton Townsend of Somerset County planter present here in Court undertook for the said Richard Carey to pay the several Officers fees due by means of the premises aff in case the same Richard Carey doth not pay the same &c

Forasmuch as a certain Sarah Ainsworth of Somerset County had not Burnt somuch tobacco as by Law she was Obliged to burn but was Willing to pay her fine for the same &c  
Wherefore it is Considered by the Court here that the afo Sarah Ainsworth pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary for his fine for and by Cuation of the premises aff twenty Shillings curr. money of Maryland and is ordered to give Security for the payment of the several Officers their fees due for Herringon John Atkinson of Somerset County planter undertakes for the said Sarah Ainsworth to pay the several Officers their fees due by means of the premises aff in case the said Sarah Ainsworth doth not pay the same &c

His Lordship. Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should attach Alexander Thomas late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his County and he should safe keep so that he should have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek in the same County the third Tuesday of November next instant One thousand Seven hundred and thirty six to answer unto his Lordship of and upon such things which on his said Lordships behalfe should be known and there Objected against him and further to do and receive what the same Court should consider of him as also to answer his not burning of One hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco taxable in the year One thousand Seven hundred and thirty four and thirty five according to act of Assembly in such case made and provided as at whidday here came the Sheriff of the County aff to wit Joseph M'Foster Yeoman and returned that he had attached the said Alexander Thomas whose
