

George Smith late of Somerset County planter came here into Court in his proper person answering to a certain writ of attachment against ^{him} for his not appearing before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset he being Legally Summoned thereto for not burning of tobacco according to act of assembly in such case made and provided and forasmuch as the said George Smith hath nothing to Object that was Materiall but was willing to pay his fine for the same &c. Therefore it is Considered by the Court here that the said George Smith be fined to his Lordship for and by occasion of the premises of Twenty Shillings Curr. money of Maryland &c.

Richard Carey late of Somerset County planter came here into Court in his proper person answering to a certain writ of attachment against him for his not burning of tobacco according to act of assembly in such case made and provided, and forasmuch as the said Richard Carey hath nothing to Object that was Materiall but was willing to pay his fine for the same &c. Therefore it is Considered by the Court here that the said Richard Carey be fined to his Lordship for and by occasion of the premises of Twenty Shillings Curr. money of Maryland &c. whereupon the said Richard Carey is ordered to give Security for the payment of the severall Officers their fees due by means of the premises and whereupon Lillston Townsend of Somerset County planter present here in Court undertook for the said Richard Carey to pay the severall Officers fees due by means of the premises and in case the said Richard Carey doth not pay the same &c.

Forasmuch as a certain Sarah Anisworth of Somerset County had not burnt so much tobacco as by Law she was Obliged to burn but was willing to pay her fine for the same &c. Wherefore it is Considered by the Court here that the said Sarah Anisworth pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary for her fine for and by occasion of the premises of Twenty Shillings Curr. money of Maryland and is ordered to give Security for the payment of the severall Officers their fees due &c. Whereupon John Atkinson of Somerset County planter undertakes for the said Sarah Anisworth to pay the severall Officers their fees due by means of the premises and in case the said Sarah Anisworth doth not pay the same &c.

His Lordship } Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should attach Alexander
Alexander Thomas } Thomas late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he should have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek in the same County the third Tuesday of November next about One thousand Seven hundred and thirty six to answer unto his Lordship of and upon such things which on his said Lordship behalf should be taken and there Objected against him and further to do and receive what the same Court should Consider of him as also to answer his not burning of One hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco of Taxable in the year One thousand Seven hundred and thirty four and thirty five according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c. at which day here came the Sheriff of the County and to wit Joseph McPherson Gent and affirmed that he had attached the said Alexander Thomas - whose
