and Clothing sufficient for such an apprentice to have & wear during the term of his servitude thereupon the said  
George Bennett is ordered to give Security for to comply with the contents aforesaid.

Whereupon the said George Bennett with George Dashill of Somerset County Gent his Security  
both present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto the said  
Cruelius Lynch the younger in twenty pounds Sterling good and Lawfull money of England of their  
body, goods, or Chattells Lands, or tenements Joynly and Severally to be made and Levied to the  
Use of the said Alexander Lynch the younger his heirs and affiries If it happen that the said  
George Bennett do not during the term of his servitude give him  
and give him fifteen months schooling, and at the Expiration of his Servitude do not give him  
anew Suit of Cloathes over and above his common wearing Cloathes and do not Likewise provide  
for his said apprentice meat drinke washing Lodging and Clothing sufficient for such an appren-  
tice to have & wear during the term of his servitude.

John Fowler . { John Fowler son of Edward Fowler late of Somerset County planter deceased  
chose Thos William his } Orphan being above the age of fourteen years came hencforth to Court in his proper per-  
son and prayd that he may be admitted to chose a certain Thomas Willian of the same  
County as his Guardian which is unto him granted &c. Whereupon the said John Fowler present in  
Court makes choice of the said Thomas Willian as his Guardian &c. Whereupon it is ordered by the  
Court here that a certain Robert Austin deliver up unto the said Guardian all the Estate of the said  
John Fowler that he hath in his hands and possession both real & personale peaceably  
and quietly and that the said Thomas Willian give Security for to comply with the Guardianship aforesaid  
Thereupon the said Thomas Willian with Underwood Planter of Somerset County planter his  
Security both present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto  
the said John Fowler in One hundred pounds Sterling good and Lawfull money of England Joynly  
and Severally of their body, goods or Chattells Lands or tenements to the use of the said John Fowler  
to be made and Levied If it happen that the said Thomas Willian do not comply with the  
Law in relation to such Guardianships as aforesaid and do not deliver up unto the said John Fowler all his  
Estate both real and personale [that he shall take into his hands and possess] peaceably and  
quietly when ever the same shall be legally required &c.
