to have carnal knowledge of her body and to beget ther and there a bastard child on the body of  
her the same Eliz<sup>t</sup> to the high displeasure of almighty God to the evil example of all others  
in such case offending contrary to the peace of the said Lord Proprietary that now is his good Rule and  
Government and against the form of the Act of Assembly in such case lately made and provided ~~be-~~

By which it was commanded the Sheriff of Somerset <sup>County</sup> that he should take the said Eliz<sup>t</sup> Ell-  
ingsworth late of Stepney parish in Somerset County Spurter if she should be found in  
his County and her should safe keep so that he might have her body before the Justice  
of his Lordship County Court of Somerset to be held in the Court house at Bridgwater the  
third Tuesday of June Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty seven to answer  
unto his said Lordship ~~as<sup>t</sup>~~. And afterwards to witt the said third Tuesday of June Anno  
Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty seven that same term before his Lordship's  
Justices at Bridgwater ~~as<sup>t</sup>~~ came the said Eliz<sup>t</sup> Ellingsworth in her proper person  
and with that she came not to the Court house but that she is fully of the gravity of the charge as<sup>t</sup> in the Indictment ~~as<sup>t</sup>~~  
and had a hearing of the indictment as<sup>t</sup> specified in manner and form as by the Indictment as<sup>t</sup>  
above against her supposed, and the premises as<sup>t</sup> expressly acknowledgeth and makes oath  
that a certain Richard Nichols is the begetter of the child she stands indicted for and puts  
herself in mercy of his Lordship ~~as<sup>t</sup>~~. Whereupon all and singular the premises  
being seen and by the Court fully understood it is considered that the aforesaid Eliz<sup>t</sup> Ellings-  
worth pay unto his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary for her fine  
by the Court hereupon her imposed for and by occasion of the premises as<sup>t</sup> whereof  
it comes <sup>as<sup>t</sup></sup> she is convicted thirty shillings Court Money of Maryland (to the use of the  
County as<sup>t</sup>) and that the said Eliz<sup>t</sup> Ellingsworth be taken to satisfy his said Lordship  
of the fine afores<sup>t</sup> ~~as<sup>t</sup>~~ Whereupon the said Elizabeth Ellingsworth is ordered to give security to have  
and keep indemnified the Justices of Somerset and their Successors from all Costs Charges and Burthenes the  
right accrued by means of the birth of the Child afores<sup>t</sup>. Whereupon the said Eliz<sup>t</sup> Ellingsworth with Walter  
Parry of Somerset County planter her security both present herein Court in their proper personack-  
nowledged themselves Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in thirty pounds.
