saiith that his father Teague Rigger son of Teague Rigger the elder told him that the first boulder of the tract of Land called the Golden Lyon being a feeder tree stood within twenty foot or thereabouts of the place sworn to by the afo^e Evidences and that the same tree which his father told him was the first boulder he hath often stood and fished off it but that he never lookt on the said tree for notches nor doth, Remanber that he ever saw on the said tree but took it from his fathers words and the said deponent further saith that he was present when James Dickerson was examined upon oath by William Holland James Neam and Ju^e Outen by virtue of a Commission from Somerset County Court who upon his said oath declared that Ambrose Rigger then possessor of the Land lying on the north side of the first boulder of the Land called the Golden Lyon and Peter Dickerson possessor on the South side of the said first boulder of the said Land Employd him the said James Dickerson to cut the ditch upon the Line as near as he could between them and that the ditch now in his view was the said ditch that the said James Dickerson swore he was Employd about and further this deponent ^{saiith} that at the time of Mary Riggis the wife of Teague Rigger the Deors being Examined by the Commissioners afo^e she was by the direction of William Holland one of the said Commissioners afo^e Led by the hand by Ambrose Rigger her son to the place Expressly by John Riggis deposition near which place one Wilson told her husband in her hearing that he had cut down a tree and made another Lower down the Creek and further saith not. Darby Riggis of Somerset County planter aged fifty three years or thereabouts being also sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God deposed and saith that Peter Dickerson and Ambrose Riggis who were possessors of the Land sworn to as Expressly in Teague Riggis deposition always allowed the afo^e feeder tree sworn to by John Riggis and Mary Riggis his wife to be the boulder that divideth the Land called the Golden Lyon in possession of Ambrose Riggis from the Land called Riggis mine in the possession of Peter Dickerson and this deponent further saith that he heard his brother Teague Riggis say that Andrew Wilson cut down the Beginning tree of his fathers Land called the Golden Lyon which stood upon Cuthage Hammock and that he had wanted him another tree Lower down the Creek and further saith not. James Neam of Somerset County planter aged Twenty Eight years or thereabouts being duly sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God by the said Commissioners deposed and saith that some year agoe his deponent with William Holland and John Outen was appointed by the Worshipfull the Justices of Somerset County Court one of the Commissioners to examine Witnesses in relation to the boundaries of a tract of Land called the Golden Lyon and that upon the Examination of Mary
