Gedwell on the twenty eighth day of May anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred thirty seven George
Layfield Complainant and Edward Franklin defendt came Robert Hodge an Evidence aged about fifty
years and being sworn as above and examined saith that he first saw the said Oak while
Oak standing about ten Paces to the right hand going up Synequeen Road and about ten Paces from
Hartfords branch Riding in Company with Edw: John Franklin that the said Franklin pointed to the said
Oak and told him this deponent that the said Oak was a bounder of Stevens Bridge and Sikevise
Abouinder of the said franklin's Land and further the said franklin told this deponent that there was
another bounder standing by the said three lins branch belonging to him the said Stevens bridge and
further saith not —

The same day came Edmund Grapper Senr aged about fifty seven years and being
Sworn and Examined as above saith that almost thirty years agoe Edw: John Franklin told him severall
times that the Oak above mentioned was a bounder of his the said franklin's Land and further saith
not — The same day came Nathaniel Grapper Senr aged fifty odd years and being
sworn and examined as above saith — That about thirty years agoe he was a looking
for cattle in company with the above named Franklin and coming along the aforesaid
Hartfords Branch the said Franklin told him that the white Oak above said was
a bound^r of his the said franklin's Land and further to the best of this deponent's mem-
ory the said Franklin told him that it was also a bound^r of Stevenses Bridge —
afterwards belonging to Cos^r Layfield and further saith not — As —
