white oak now in his view and told him that tree was the boulder of four tracts of land and that a tract called Gleneath was one of them which tree stands on the westernmost side of Pocumoke River about fifty yards from the said River upon a point of high land near the side of a small gutt known by the name of Cat Gull and further saith not

June the 7th 1736 Alexander Macredy of Somerset County planter aged fifty years or thereabouts being by us sworn upon the holy evangelist of almighty God doth depose and saith, that about thirty years ago (to the best of his knowledge) he was shewed an old rotten oak stump near the head of pocumoke Bay where we caused a pine sapling to be shipped on four sides between Spenciers point and Michal Giffens plantation and was told that was the boulder between Michal Giffens and Edmon Howards land but saw no markes in itt and this deponent further saith that some years after he was in company with M^r. William Whittington the then Surveyor who was employed by Michal Giffens to run out some part of his land in order to discover some land which he intended to rear and that the said Whittington then began at the old stump as further saith not - The above depositions was taken before us the

subscribers being first duly qualified according to Law the day and year above written June the 7th 1736 Jacob Adams of Somerset County aged sixty years or thereabouts being sworn upon the holy evangelist of almighty God doth depose and saith that about twenty eight or twenty nine years ago Michal Giffens and M^r. W^m. Whittington who was then Surveyor to lay out some part of his land in order to discover if there was any vacant at the head of his land and that they began at a rotten oak stump to the best of his knowledge there was no markes to be seen in itt standing between Spenciers point and Michal Giffens plantation where we caused a small pine to be shipped on four sides standing within ten or a dozen yards of the bay side and further saith not.

June the 7th 1736 Sarah Byer wife of Robert Byer of Somerset County aged fifty year or thereabouts being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God doth depose & saith that about thirty years ago she saw Philip Conway and John Manlove put their hands upon a white oak now in her view standing on the West side of Pocumoke River about fifty yards from the said River near a small gutt called Cat Gull and that they told her that Denkins Lewis man told them that was denkins Lewis tree and further saith not.
