Whereupon Edward Rownd of Somerset County Gent present herein Court in his proper person undertook for the said Samuel Hopkins that in case the said John Donelson do at any time within a year & day appear and make all or any part of the said Samuel Hopkins claim against him appear to be satisfied or otherwise to be undone before the laying of the attachment & that then the said Samuel Hopkins shall make restitution unto him the said John Donelson of all or such part thereof as shall be made appear to be undone or that he the said Edward Rownd will do the same for him &c

Therefore it is considered that the said Twelve pounds Court money of Maryland by the Jurors & in form of found be condemned in the hands of the said William Whittington as of the rights and credits of the said John Donelson & to be satisfied unto the said Samuel Hopkins his damages and Costs and that he have thereof execution according to act of assembly and also it is considered that the said Samuel Hopkins recover against the said William Whittington
