Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should  
take Nicholas Kelley late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in  
his Bailly wick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before  
the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dwidung Creek in the County afo the  
third Tuesday of June Anno Dom. One thousand Seven hundred and thirty seven to answer unto  
Benjamin Tule of a plea of trespass upon the case &c. and that thereof he should not fail &c.

All which day here before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset at Dwidung Creek  
Came the ad Benjamin Tule by his attorney <sup>George Douglas</sup> and the Sheriff of Somerset County afo to wit Joseph  
Maulester Gent. at the same day here returned that he had taken the ad Nicholas Kelley whose  
body here at this day he had ready to answer the ad Benjamin Tule of the afo plea as to him it  
was commanded - Whereupon at the same day came the ad Nicholas Kelley by Francis Allen his  
attorney and the ad Benjamin Tule then and there his writt afo against the ad Nicholas did not prove  
wite with fact but voluntarily suffered his Suit to be discontinued -

Therefore afterwards to wit that same day by discretion of the Justices here were ad judged  
the same Nicholas Kelley  
and Charges by him about his defence in that part sustained according to the form of the Statute in such  
case that of Statute made and provided and the ad Benjamin Tule in money and that the ad Nicholas
