Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that of the goods & chattels which were of the late Burn Cuterbridge late of Somerset County Manner Stephen Horsay adm<sup>r</sup> of F<sup>d</sup> otherwise lately called Burn Cuterbridge of Somerset County in Maryland & the Cuterbridge who died intestate at his said at the time of his death in the hands of Stephen Horsay late of Somerset County planter Administrator of all and singular the goods and chattels lights and credits which were of his said Burn in his bailywiche he should make as well a certain Debt of sixty pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money which Lewis Hale Esq<sup>r</sup> George Hale, John Hale and Mathias Hale Esq<sup>s</sup> in the same Court before the Justices thereof at dividing Creek recovered against him as also four hundred and fif- teen pounds of tobacco which to the same Lewis, Geo: John and Mathias Hale in the same Court were adjudged for their damages which they had by reason of the detaining of the same debt to be deprived of the goods and chattels which were of the aff<sup>t</sup> Burn at the time of his death in the hands of the same Stephen unadministered if so much in his hands he hath and if so much in his hands he hath not then his damages aff<sup>t</sup> to be levied of the proper goods and chattels of the same Stephen
