Bailiffs and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the  
Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held in the Court house at  
dividing Creek in the same County the third Wednesday of June next to satisfy Richard  
Gildart of Liverpool in England as well a certain debt of twenty two thousand  
four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco which the same Richard in the same  
Court before the Justices thereof at dividing Creek as recovered against him as of  
two hundred and ninety nine pounds of tobacco which to the same Richard in  
the same Court were adjudged for his damages which he had by occasion of the detention  
of the same debt whereof the same W<sup>m</sup> is Comptrol<sup>r</sup> &c. At which day here before the  
Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset at dividing Creek came the said  
Richard by W<sup>m</sup> Goldborough his attorney and the sheriff of the County as to with  
Joseph M<sup>re</sup> Ceder Gent. and at the same day here returned that he had taken the  
as William Wye whose body here at this day he had ready to satisfy. As to him it  
was Comanded &c. And the same Sheriff at the same day altho' solemnly  
called brings not in the body of the same William Wye according to the return of the writ as but  
makes default &c.

Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that of the goods &  
Chattels which were of Burn Outbridge late of Somerset County Manner  
Stephen Horsey admd. of Dec<sup>r</sup>. otherwise lately called Burn Outbridge of Somerset County in many times  
Burn Outbridge who died Intestate as his said at the time of his death in the hands of Stephen  
Horsey late of Somerset County Justice Administrator of all and singular the goods and Chattels rights  
and Credits which were of the same Burn in his bailiwick he should make as well a certain Debt of  
sixty pounds Curr<sup>t</sup> money which Lewis Gale Esq. George Gale, John Gale and Mathias Gale Esqrs. in the same  
Court before the Justices thereof at dividing Creek recovered against him as also four hundred and fifty  
seven pounds of tobacco which to the same Lewis, Geo. John and Mathias Gale in the same Court were  
adjudged for their damages which they had by occasion of the detaining of the same debt to be levied of  
the goods and Chattels which were of the said Burn at the time of his death in the hands of the said  
Stephen unadministred if so much in his hands he hath and if so much in his hands he hath  
not then the damages as to be levied of the proper goods and Chattels of the same Stephen
