and ordinary for house of entertainment at his house at wickocooco in the

he giving security according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.

shillings Currant money of Maryland for every year he shall keep such ordinary or
house of entertainment &c. Likewise the said Thomas Walker with Francis
Berons and Robert Givans his securitys all present herein Court in their
proper persons as aforesaid acknowledged themselves Indebted unto his Lordship
the Lord Proprietary in the sum of forty pounds Currant money of Maryland
of their goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements joyntly and severally to the use
