James Rownd James Rownd of Somerset County Inholder came here into Court in his proper
discre^e & Lewg^d person and pray^s that he may have the liberty to keep an ordinary or house
of Entertainment in his house in allhollows parish at the seaside in the

County and for the use and convenience of the inhabitants travellers and strangers
as to them respectively shall seeme meet which is by the Court here unto him granted
he giving security according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c

Whereupon the said James Rownd with James Martin & Edward Rownd
both of the County aforesaid his securitys all present herein Court in their
proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto His Lordship the
Lord Proprietary of the province of Maryland in the sum of five pounds Court
money of their goods and chattles Lands and tenements jointly and severally
to be made and Levied to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and successors if
it happen that the said James Rownd do and shall not pay unto his said Lordship
fifty shillings Court-money of Maryland for every year he shall keep such
ordinary or house of entertainment &c Likewise the said James Rownd with
James Martin and Edward Rownd his securitys aforesaid all present herein Court
in their proper persons aforesaid acknowledged themselves Indebted unto his
Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of forty pound Court-money of Maryland
of their goods and chattles Lands and tenements jointly and severally to the
use of his said Lordship his heirs and successors to be made and levied if it happen
that the said James Rownd do not keep good rules and orders and do suffer idle
