Likewise the said James Anderson with Robert Givans and George Benston his security &c all present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of forty pounds Curr. money of Maryland of their goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Joyntly and severally to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors to be made and Levied if it happen that the said James Anderson do not keep good rules and orders and do suffer Idle loose and disorderly persons to <sup>gamble</sup> commit disorders or other Irregularities in his ordinary or house of entertainment during the time that he shall keep the same Contrary to the true intent and meaning of the act of assembly in such case made and provided &c

Toward s Memorandum at a session of the peace of his Lordship the right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of the province of Maryland held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County on the third Tuesday of June to wit the Twenty fifth day of the same month and Tow. One thousand Seven hundred and thirty seven before Robert King Gent. and others his associates Justices of his the said Lord Proprietary the peace in the County of Somerset and also divers felonyes trespasses and other Malefeasances in the same County committed to hear and determine as charged by the oath of William Holland and twelve others being presented that Isaac Bredel late of said Hollow parish in the County aforesaid on the 7th Day of March Anno Dom 1736 did commit wilful and corrupt Perjury in swearing to a false account against the Estate of John Hamlin decd. late of Somerset County information made to us Grand Jurors by James Mumford

Thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take the said Isaac Bredel late of Somerset County prisoner if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safely keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordship's County Court of Somerset to be hold at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August then next to answer unto
