

exposed in a cultivated field and not considered of much value, there is also about fifty young apple trees in fields adjoining house but as they are not fenced off from pasture fields they are apt to be destroyed.

The number of acres in said Estate is three hundred and ten acres divided into four fields mostly stake and capped fence, and mostly cleared lands except around the creek shores, we judge that there is about thirty acres of woods or uncleared lands leaving the cleared lands two hundred and eighty acres cultivated, one fourth in wheat one fourth in oats, one fourth in corn and the balance in pasture, we would recommend to seed left oats and more wheat and corn.

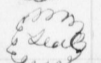
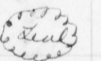
