His Lordship's Somerset Memorandum that at a session of the peace of his Lordship the right Honourable the Lord
Francis Talke proprietary of the province of Maryland held at dividing Creek in Somerset County the third Tuesday of March to wit the seventeenth day of the same month anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty before his said Lordships Justices the peace in the County aforesaid to keep assynd by the Oath of twelve Juries being presented that Francis Talke late of Stepney parish in the said County of Somerset planter the twenty fourth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty with force and arms at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid the cabin of a certain Indian Punguit then and there did break and enter and give undressed decorations of the value of five hundred pounds of tobacco of the goods and chattles of the said Indian Punguit then and there found then and there feloniously did steal take and bear away contrary to the peace of the said Lord proprietor that now is his good rule and Government and against the form of the act of Assembly in such case lately made & provided

Thereupon it is commanded the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take the said Francis Talke if he should be found in his baileywicke and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June then next following to answer unto his said Lordship of the Indictment aforesaid then

And now to wit the sixteenth day of June anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and forty One at about their field at dividing Creek in and for the County aforesaid before the Justices Head of Court the aforesaid Francis Talke in custody of the Sheriff of the County aforesaid in whose custody before that time for the cause aforesaid was committed and to the barre now here set in his proper person and being lawfully asked how he of the felony aforesaid as by the Indictment aforesaid above upon him imposed will thereof acquit himself says that he is in no case thereof guilty and hereupon of good and true he puts himself upon the Country . . . Therefore it is commanded the Sheriff of the County aforesaid that immediately he should cause to be sent to before his Lordships Justices here at dividing Creek twelve men by whom he who neither doth recoginize him and the Jurors of that same Jury by John Hardy Gentleman Sheriff of the County aforesaid to this Imparicelle with Edmund Hough Joshua Caldwell, John Dennis Jr. Joseph Miller, Mickle Dower Huett Nutten, Josiah Evans, John Stile, Solomon Long, Robert Mitchell, Daniel Jones and Wm. Brown being called same who to say the truth of the premises aforesaid being elected tried and sworn upon their Oath say that the aforesaid Francis Talke is not guilty of the felony aforesaid in the Indictment aforesaid above specified in manner & form as the aforesaid Francis Talke for himself above by pleading alledged

Whereupon all and singular the premises being seen and by the Court here fully understood It is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Francis Talke be quiet and goe thereof without day also it is considered by the Court here that the said Francis Talke give security for the payment of all fee or charges by means of the premises and Indictment aforesaid to any person or persons whatsoever; but for want whereof the said Francis Talke is committed into the custody of the Sheriff of the County aforesaid thereto remane the said Sheriff to wit John Hardy Gentleman being present took charge of the said Francis Talke accordingly then
