At which day here came again as well the a^r Francis Allen Jun^r as the a^r Robert Geddes and Susannah his wife by their attorney a^r and whereupon the said Robert and Susannah pray further leave thereof to Imparte here untill next Court to be held at dividing Creek in and for the County as the third Tuesday of August then next following and they have it and the same day is given to the a^r Francis here also &c

At which day here came again as well the a^r Francis Allen Jun^r as the a^r Robert Geddes and Susannah his wife by their attorney a^r and whereupon the said Robert and Susannah as before defends the force and Injury whereto and say that she the said Susannah is not guilty of the premisses by the said Francis above upon her Imposed in manner and form as the said Francis above against them hath complained and of this they put themselves upon the Country And the pl^t in like manner

Therefore it is commanded the Sheriff that immediately he cause to come here before his Lordships Justices Twelve &c by whom &c and who neither &c to require & because as well &c and whereupon the aforesaid Francis Allen Jun^r then and there his writt aforesaid against the aforesaid Robert Geddes and Susannah his wife did not prosecute with effect but voluntarily suffered his suit to be discontinued.

Wherefore it is considered that the aforesaid Francis Allen Jun^r and his pledges of Prosecuting to w^t John Doe and Richard Rose are in mercy and that the aforesaid Robert Geddes and Susannah his wife doe therof without day &c also it is considered that the aforesaid Robert Geddes and Susannah his wife recover against the aforesaid Francis Allen Jun^r three hundred and Sixty One pounds of tobacco for their costs and charges by them about their defense in that part sustained to the same Robert and Susannah by those found here of their agent adjudged according to the form of the Statute hereof lately made and provided and that the aforesaid Robert and Susannah have therof Crediton &c

gd. Alexander Buncle

Command was given to the sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Hugh Henry late of Somerset County planter and dictus Hugh Henry if he should be found in his Bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty nine to answer unto Alex^r Buncle of a plea that he render unto him twelve pounds nine shillings and ten pence half penny current money of Maryland which to him he owes and unjustly detains &c and the same day is given to the aforesaid Alexander here &c

At which day here came the a^r Alex^r Buncle by George Douglas his attorney and the sheriff to w^t John Henry gent now here returned that he had taken the a^r Hugh Henry whose body here at this day he had ready to answer the a^r Alexander Buncle of the a^r pleas to him it was commanded &c

Whereupon came her into court a certain John Schofield of Somerset County planter in his proper person and understood for the said Hugh Henry [sic] likewise the said Hugh Henry present here in court in his proper person assumed upon himself that if it should happen that Judgment in the plea a^r should be rendered for the same Alexander against him the said Hugh or that he the said Hugh should be therein convicted that then he the said Hugh should pay and satisfie unto the said Alex^r the
