Plaintes of the said John Evans towards Satisfying unto the said Nehemiah King his damages and all Costs and Charges  
accruing by means of the attachment aforesaid.

Thereupon George Douglas of Somersel County Gentleman present herein Court in his proper person  
undertook for the said Nehemiah King according to act of Assembly in such Case made and provided that In case  
the said John Evans do at any time within a year and day appear and make all or any part of the said Nehemiah  
King, same against him, appear to be satisfied, or have been made, before the Day of his attachment, that then  
the said Nehemiah King shall make Restitution unto the said John Evans, of all or such part <sup>whereof</sup> as the said John —  
shall make appear to be made to him, or that he the said George Douglas will do it for him —

Therefore it is Considered by the Court here, that the aforesaid Five hundred and Sixty pounds  
of tobacco, and One hundred and Sixteen pounds of broad glass, of the value of ten pounds of tobacco, so as to  
acknowledged by the aforesaid Sarah Rose Esq<sup>r</sup>, be condemned in the hands of the said Sarah Rose Esq<sup>r</sup>, as of the goods  
and Plaines of the aforesaid John Evans, towards Satisfying unto the said Nehemiah King his damage aforesaid, and  
all Costs and Charges accruing by means of the attachment aforesaid, and that the said Nehemiah have these of payment or —  
Whereaspon the aforesaid Sarah Rose Esq<sup>r</sup>, an other of the Garnishers, of the aforesaid John Evans, discharged by the said  
Nehemiah King off and from the attachment aforesaid.

W<sup>d</sup> William Bowly  
vs Barnard Ramsey

Command was given to the Sheriff of Somersel County that  
he should take Barnard Ramsey late of Somersel County planter if  
he should be found in his baileywink and him should saye keep so that  
he might have his body before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somersel to  
be held at dividing frēsh the third Thursday of June Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred  
and forty one to answer unto William Bowly of a plea of trespass upon the law & to  
same day is given to the W<sup>d</sup> William here to. And hereupon the said William declared  
against the W<sup>d</sup> Barnard in the plea afores in form following. . . . Somersel a. Barnard  
Ramsey late of Somersel County planter was attached to answer unto William Bowly of a  
plea of trespass upon the law & . . . And Whereupon the said William by George  
Douglas his attorney complains that whereas the said Barnard on the fourth day of  
August Anno Domini MDCCLXXXIX at the County aforesid did make his own note  
in writing called a promissory note with the proper name and hand writing of the said  
Barnard signed and the said note to the said William then and there did deliver by which  
note the said Barnard did promise to pay to the said William the sum of three pounds fifteen  
Shillings to be paid in Indian corn at twenty pence Bushells at or before the first day of  
January then next ensuing the date of that note by means whereof and by force of the Statute in
