This day to wit the 24 day of April 1741
Came Capt. John Newbold in his proper
person and made oath on the holy Evangelist
of Almighty God that the above account as it
stands stated is just and true and that he never
received part or percell of the above acct. more
then credit given for nor satisfaction for the
same — Sworn before Samuel Hopkins

A copy of the foregoing declaration was made and sent to be served on the Def^t with the writ in the plea a^d —
At which day here came the a^d John Newbold by his Attorney a^d and the sheriffe to wit John Standy Gent. now here returned
that he had taken the a^d Paul Alexander whose body here at this day he had ready to answer the a^d John Newbold of the a^d plea as
to him it was Comanded — And further the said sheriffe returned that he had served the a^d Paul Alexander with a copy of the
foregoing declaration according to Act of Assembly in such case made and provided &c —
Whereupon came here into Court a certain Nicholas Fountain of back creek & Thomas Keyley both of Somerset
County in their proper persons, and undertook and each of them undertook, for the said Paul Alexander (likewise the said Paul
Alexander present here in Court in his proper person, assumed upon himself) that if it should happen that Judgment in the plea a^d
should be rendered for the same John, against the said Paul, or that he the said Paul should be therein Convict, that then he the said
Paul should pay and satisfie unto the said John, the Judgment of the Court thereupon, or render his body in execution of such
Judgment, to the prison of the sheriffe of the County a^d, in satisfaction thereof, or that they the same Nicholas Fountain &
Thomas Keyley will do the same for him &c —
And the a^d Paul Alexander by William Arbuckle his Attorney comes and defends the force and Injury when
and saith that he cannot deny the Action a^d of the a^d John Newbold nor but that he did assume upon himself in manner &
form as the a^d John above against him hath Complained and as to the damage of the same John by him by Occasion of the
premises in that part Sustained the said John Paul saith and Acknowledgeth that the a^d John hath sustained damages by
Occasion of the premises beyond his Costs and Charges by him about his suit in this part apposed to three pounds fifteen
shillings
