John Standif Gent: now here returned the dñe: with thereof endorsed in these words following

I have attached the goods within named of the value within mentioned of the goods  
of Daniel Brown in the wch hereto annexed mentioned which I have recd before the Justice  
in the said wch named as by the said wch I am commanded and further certify that the said  
Daniel Brown has no other goods chattels or credits within my Jurisdiction which I can attach  
for the purposes in the said wch named so answer John Standif Sheriff.

A Schedule of the Goods and Chattels of Daniel Brown attached for the use  
of Capt David Wilson and appraised by William Dixon Benjamin Langford Stephen &  
Honey June: and Henry Smith being first duly sworn to make a just and true appraisement  
thereof and have valued them as followeth to witt.

To 1 Cow and Calf at 225<sup>stated</sup>

To 1 Two year Old heifer £16. 0

The above Goods and Chattels were appraised and valued this 26<sup>th</sup> day of  
June One thousand seven hundred and forty one by us W<sup>m</sup> Dixon, Stephen Honey Jr. Benjamin  
Langford, Henry Smith.

Whereupon the aforesaid David Wilson in his proper person present herein  
lent pray that upon giving of security according to act of assembly in such case made and provided, the aforesaid  
Cow and Calf, and One Two years Old heifer, of the value of Two hundred and Twenty five pounds of tobacco, and One pound  
five shillings curr<sup>n</sup> money of Maryland, so as aforesaid attached, may be condemned as the goods and Chattels of the said  
Daniel Brown, towards satisfying unto him the aforesaid Twenty four Shillings and Eight pence curr<sup>n</sup> money, and all costs  
and charges expended on the attachment aforesaid.

Whereupon Thomas Hayward of Somerset County, present herein Court in his proper person undertook  
for the said David Wilson, according to act of assembly in such case made and provided, that in case the said Daniel  
Brown do at any time within a year and day appear and make all or any part of the said David  
Wilson's claim against him, appears to be undue or have been undue, before the laying of this  
attachment, that then the said David Wilson shall make restitution unto the said Daniel Brown  
of all or such part thereof, as the said Daniel shall make appear to be undue & or that he the  
said Thomas Hayward will do it for him &c.

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Cow and Calf, and One Two  
years Old heifer, all of the value of Two hundred and Twenty five pounds of tobacco, and One pound five shillings  
curr<sup>n</sup> money, so as aforesaid attached, be condemned as the goods and Chattels of the aforesaid Daniel Brown,  
towards satisfying unto the aforesaid David Wilson, the aforesaid One pound four Shillings and Eight pence  
curr<sup>n</sup> money, and all costs and charges expended by means of the attachment aforesaid, and that the said David have thereto  
remained. Hm
