Nevertheless the a<sup>d</sup> Francis his promise and assumption aforesaid in form aforesaid made not regarding but minding and fraudulently intending the same Henry Lowes in this part craftily and subtilly to deceive and defraud the a<sup>d</sup> Four pounds eleven shillings and one penny half penny or any penny thereof unto the same Henry Lowes he hath not paid or in any sort hether to contented altho' the same to do the a<sup>d</sup> Francis afterwards (to w<sup>t</sup>) the same day and year above mentioned and often since that time at Somerset County a<sup>d</sup> by the same Henry Lowes was requested Wherupon the same Henry says he is worse and hath damage to the value of ten pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money of the province a<sup>d</sup> and thereupon he brings suit<sup>t</sup> Prog<sup>r</sup> P. And the aforesaid Francis Tate by his attorney comes and defends the force and injury whereto and prayeth leave hereof to Imparte hereunto next Court to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid Henry here also to —

All which day here came again as well the aforesaid Henry Lowes as the a<sup>d</sup> Francis Tate by their attorneys a<sup>d</sup> and Whereupon the said Francis Tate prayeth further leave thereof to Imparte hereunto next Court to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid Henry herealso — All which day here came again as well the a<sup>d</sup> Henry Lowes as the a<sup>d</sup> Francis Tate by their attorneys a<sup>d</sup> and Whereupon the said Francis Tate as before defends the force and injury whereto and saith that he did not assume upon himself in manner and form as the said Henry above against him hath complained and of this he puts himself upon the Country &<sup>t</sup> and the a<sup>d</sup> Henry in like manner —

Therefore it is commanded the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should cause to come before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held
