Leave thereof to Imparle here until next Court to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June then next following and
he hath it and the same day is given to the afo^r John here also —

¶ At which day here came again as well the afo^r John Newbold as the afo^r Joarib Field by their Attorney afo^r And
thereupon the same attorney of the said Joarib saith that he cannot deny the action aforesaid of the aforesaid
John Newbold nor can he say but that the said Joarib did assault upon him selfe in manner and forme as
the aforesaid John Newbold above against him hath complained and as to the damage of the same John Newbold
by him by occasion of the premises in that part sustained the same Joarib Field saith and acknowledgeth that the afo^r
John hath sustained damages by occasion of the premises beyond his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part
apposed to ten pounds four shillings and Eleven pence curr^t paper money of Maryland and not more and because the afo^r
John denies not this but the same allegation grants to be true prays Judgment for those damages above acknowledged together
with his costs and charges afo^r to him to be adjudged —

Therefore by consent of the parties afo^r it is considered that the afo^r John Newbold recover against the
afo^r Joarib Field his damages afo^r to the afo^r ten pounds four shillings and Eleven pence curr^t paper money of Maryland by
the same Joarib in form afo^r acknowledged as also:

¶ At which day here came the afo^r Archibald McNeal by George Douglas his Attorney and the Sheriff to wit John
Wildman hent now here retaigned that he had taken the afo^r John Wildman whose body here at this day he had ready to answer
the afo^r Archibald McNeal of the afo^r plea as to him it was commanded —

¶ At which day here came again the party afo^r by their Attorney afo^r And hereupon the said Archibald McNeal
complained against the afo^r John Wildman in the plea afo^r in form following —

trespass upon the case^r And whereupon the said Archibald by George Douglas his Attorney complains that whereas on the Eleventh
