Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Benjamin Sharp late  
of Somerset County Shewright if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he  
might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of  
June Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one to satisfy William Gray as well a certain debt of eight hundred and —  
ninety two pounds of tobacco which the same William Gray in the same Court before the Justices thereof at dividing Creek recovered  
against him as of Two hundred and sixty six pounds of tobacco which to the same William Gray in the same Court were adjudged for  
his damages which he had by occasion of the detention of that same debt whereof he is convict & and the same day is given to the aforesaid  
William hereafter —

At which day here came the aforesaid William Gray in his proper person and the sheriff to will John Hardy  
gent now here returned that he had taken the aforesaid Benj. Sharp whose body here at this day he had ready to satisfy the aforesaid William  
Gray of his debt and damages aforesaid as to him it was commanded —

for Levin Hale Esq.

Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that of the goods and chattels of  
Francis Tate late of Somerset County Inholder otherwise called Francis Tate of Somerset County and  
Province aforesaid in your bailiwick you make as well a certain debt of Eighty pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money of Maryland  
which Levin Hale Esq. in his Lordships County Court before the Justices thereof at dividing Creek recovered against him as two  
hundred and ninety seven pounds of tobacco which to the same Levin in the same Court were adjudged for his damages which he had  
by occasion of the detention of the same debt and that same money and Tobacco you have before the Justices of his Lordships  
County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June then next following to render the aforesaid Levin of his  
debt and damages aforesaid whereof he is convict & and the same day is given to the aforesaid Levin hereafter —

All which day here came the aforesaid Levin Hale Esq. by George Douglas his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County  
to will John Hardy gent now here returned the aforesaid writ in manner following —

An Inventory of the goods and chattels of Francis Tate being seized and appraised for the use of the aforesaid Levin Hale  
by us the subscribers in sum money this 6 day of May 1741 To 1 mare and saddle seven pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money — £7 —

By virtue of the writ hereto annexed to me directed I have cause to be made of the goods and chattels of  
the within named Francis Tate the within sum of Seven pounds eight pence money of Maryland and the said sum of Seven pounds have ready  
before the Justices in the said writ named at the day and place within contained to satisfy the said Levin Hale in part of his debt  
and damages in the said writ mentioned as by the said writ I am commanded and I further certify to the said Justices that the said  
Francis Tate hath no goods and chattels in any my bailiwick whereof I can make the residue of the said debt and damages in the  
writ named as by that writ I am required —
