Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Benjamin Sharp late of Somerset County Shipwright if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one to satisfy William Gray as well a certain debt of Eight hundred and ninety two pounds of tobacco which the same William Gray in the same Court before the Justices thereof at dividing Creek recovered against him as of Two hundred and sixty six pounds of tobacco which to the same William Gray in the same Court were adjudged for his damages which he had by Occasion of the detention of that same debt whereof he is convicted and the same day is given to the ap^{ts} William here^t

At which day here came the ap^{ts} William Gray in his proper person and the sheriff to wit John Handy Gent now here returned that he had taken the ap^{ts} Benje Sharp whose body here at this day he had ready to satisfy the ap^{ts} William Gray of his debt and damages ap^{ts} as to him it was commanded

Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that of the goods and Chattels of Francis Tate late of Somerset County Inholder otherwise called Francis Tate of Somerset County and province ap^{ts} in your bailiwick you make as well a certain debt of Eighty pounds Curr^t money of Maryland which Levin Gale Esq^r in his Lordships County Court before the Justices thereof at dividing Creek recovered against him as two hundred and ninety seven pounds of tobacco which to the same Levin in the same Court were adjudged for his damages which he had by Occasion of the detention of the same debt and that same money and Tobacco you have before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June then next following to render the ap^{ts} Levin of his debt and damages ap^{ts} whereof he is convicted and the same day is given to the ap^{ts} Levin here^t

All which day here came the aforesaid Levin Gale Esq^r by George Douglas his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County to wit John Handy Gent now here returned the aforesaid writ in manner following

An Inventory of the goods and Chattels of Francis Tate being seized and appraised for the use of Levin Gale by us the Subscribers in Curr^t money this 6th day of May 1741 To wit mare and Saddle seven pounds Curr^t money -- 27 --

By virtue of the writ hereto annexed to me directed I have caused to be made of the goods and Chattels of the within named Francis Tate the within sum of Seven pounds Curr^t money of Maryland and the said sum of Seven pounds have ready before the Justices in the said writ named at the day and place within contained to satisfy the said Levin Gale in part of his debt and damages in the said writ mentioned as by the said writ I am commanded and I further certify to the said Justices that the said Francis Tate hath no goods and Chattels in any my bailiwick whereof I can make the residue of the said debt and damages in the writ named as by that writ I am required
