at present saving to the parties afo. —

At which day here came again the afo. Francis Henderson by his Attorney afo. and the afo. Seward  
Tomlinson altho' solemnly called came not nor his will afo. against the afo. Francis Henderson further prosecuted &c —

Therefore he and his pledges of prosecuting are in mercy and let the said Seward Tomlinson name pledges & and that  
the afo. Francis Henderson goe thereof without Day also it is considered that the afo. Francis Henderson recover against the afo.
