Rt. William Scott vs. Joshua Sturges

Command was given to the sheriffs of Somerset County that he should take Joshua Sturges late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty nine to answer unto William Scott of a plea of trespass upon the law &c. and the same day is given to the said William Scott . . . . . At which day here came the said William Scott by Robert Jenchins Henry his attorney and the Sheriffs to with John Henry Gent: now here Returned that he had taken the said Joshua Sturges whose body hereat this day he had ready to answer the said William Scott of the said plea as to him it was commanded.

Whereupon the said Joshua Sturges puts in his place George Douglas Gent: attorney at Law against the said William Scott of the said plea . . . . . And thereupon at the request of the parties the day is to them now here given untill next Court to be held at dividing Creek in and for the County of the third Tuesday of August then next following in the same state as at present saving to the parties &c. . . . .

All which day here came again the parties by their attorneys and hereupon the said William Scott complains against the said Joshua Sturges in the plea in form following. . . . . Somerset vs. Joshua Sturges late of Somerset County Planter was attached to answer unto William Scott of a plea of trespass upon the law &c. . . . .

And whereupon the same William by Robert Jenchins Henry his attorney complains that whereas the said Joshua the thirtieth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred thirty and nine at Somerset County was indebted to the same William in the sum of twenty and one pounds Curr: money of Maryland for sundry articles properly chargeable in
