Therefore by consent of the parties a<sup>o</sup> it is Considered that the a<sup>o</sup> John Filbee recover against the a<sup>o</sup> William King his damages a<sup>o</sup> to the a<sup>o</sup> five pounds Eleven shillings and Six pence Currant money by the same William in form a<sup>o</sup> Acknowledged as a<sup>o</sup> ~~Two hundred thirty two~~ <sup>Two hundred thirty two</sup> pounds of tobacco for his Costs and Charges a<sup>o</sup> to the same John at his request by the Court now here of the a<sup>o</sup> of the parties a<sup>o</sup> adjudged which certain damages in the whole Amounts to five pounds Eleven shillings and Six pence Currant money and: ~~Two hundred & thirty two~~ <sup>Two hundred & thirty two</sup> pounds of tobacco and the a<sup>o</sup> William in mercy &
