that he is in no hopes of getting clear he therefore designs to petition the Assembly for Relief and prays your worships approbation
on his behalf according to an Order of Council in such Case and provided and he as in duty bound shall pray - Francis Tate

The petition afo. being read and heard and fully understood, It is considered and Ordered that a Certificate be
made to the said Francis Tate pursuant to a resolve of the upper house of Assembly bearing date the third day of September -
Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty one

Ordered that Mrs. Katherine Hownds be allowed one thousand pounds of tobacco she bringing in the second best peice of Linnen agreeable to
act of assembly in such Case made and provided and that she have an Order on Capt. John Handy high Sher of Somerset County
for the same &c.

Ordered that Mrs. Ellinor ^{wife of Mr. Whittington King} King be allowed four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco she bringing in the sixth best peice of Linnen
agreeable to act of assembly in such Case made and provided and that she have an Order on Capt. John Handy high Sheriff of Somerset
County for the same &c.

Ordered that Mrs. Rebecca Smith be allowed four hundred pounds of tobacco she bringing in the seventh best peice of Linnen agreeable to
Act.
