use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors to be made and Levied If it happen that the said Sarah
Mears do not make her personall appearance before his said Lordships Justices at the next Court to be
held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November then next following and doe not then and there
give such Evidence as she shall know on behalfe of his said Lordship against the abd Absolom Hobbs
and that she do not depart the same Court without leave &c And afterwards the same Joseph Standford
and Sarah Mears of said from the Recognizance aforesaid are by the Court here discharged &c.

The same .. Somerset p^r Memorandum That at a Session of the peace of his Lordship
Marjoram Mallard. the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of the province of Maryland
held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County the third Tuesday of June. to wit.
the sixteenth day of the same month Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one
before his said Lordships Justices the peace in this County aforesaid to keep aforesaid by the oath of
twelve Jurors presented that Marjoram Mallard late of All Hallows Parish in the said County
of Somerset Spinster the first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and thirty nine at the parish aforesaid in this County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court
Court did commit Fornication with a certain person unknown and did permit the same unknown
person on her body then and there carnal knowledge to have and a bastard Child on her body
then and there to beget to the high displeasure of almighty God to the evill example of all
others in such case offending contrary to the peace of the right Honourable the Lord Proprietary
that now is his good Rule and Government and against the form of the act of assembly in such case
lately made and provided.....

Thereupon it was commanded the Sheriff of this County aforesaid that he
should take the said Marjoram Mallard if she should be found in his baileywick and her should
safe keep so that he might have her body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of
Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August One thousand seven hundred and
forty one to answer unto his said Lordships of this Indictment aforesaid.....

And now to wit at a Court held for the County aforesaid the third Tuesday of August being the
Eighteenth day of the same month Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one before his
said Lordships Justices at Dividing Creek came his aforesaid Marjoram Mallard in her proper person and
had a hearing of the Indictment aforesaid and saith that she cannot deny but that she is guilty of the
same
