Evans to the Grand Jury &c

Whereupon came here into Court the aforesaid Joseph Lewis in his proper person and undertook for the said Rachel Barnett and Acknowledged himselfe Indebted unto his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary of Maryland in twenty pounds (and money of said province of his body goods or Chattles Lands or tenements to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors to be made and Paid) If it happen that the said Rachel Barnett do not make her personall appearance before his said Lordships Justices at the next Court to be held at dividing Creek the the third Tuesday of November then next following and doe not then and there give such Evidence as she shall know on behalfe of his said Lordship against the aforesaid Gammage Evans and that she do depart the same Court without leave &c

The Same Francis Tate.

Commercel p. Memorandum That at a session of the peace of his Lordships the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of the Province of Maryland held at dividing Creek in the County aforesaid the third Tuesday of March to wit the seventeenth day of the same month Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and forty before his said Lordships Justices the peace in the County aforesaid to keep assigned by the Oath of Twelve Jurors presented that Francis Tate of Stepien parish for selling of Liquor without Licence which he had done for some time and in the month of February last did sell to John Shockley one qt. of Rum and did demand and receive for the same one bushell of Indian Corn

By which it was Commaided the Sheriffe of the County aforesaid that he should take the said Francis Tate if he to answer &c and afterward to wit the same day and Year abovesaid before his said Lordships Justices at about then held at dividing Creek in and for the County aforesaid came the said Francis Tate in his proper person. and thereupon the said Francis Tate is Ordered by the Court here to give Security for his appearance at the next Court to be held at dividing Creek in and for the County aforesaid the third Tuesday of June then next following to answer unto the presentment aforesaid &c but for want thereof the said Francis Tate is Committed into the Custody of the Sheriffe of the County aforesaid there to remain until he shall be from thence be delivered by due Course of Law &c

At which said third Tuesday of June Anno Domini One thousand seven

hundred and forty One at about then held at dividing Creek by his said Lordships Justices came the aforesaid Francis Tate in his proper person in Custody of the Sheriffe of the County aforesaid in whose Custody for the Cause aforesaid was Committed and being by the said Sheriffe Led to the Barre is thereupon Instantly Ordered to give security for his appearance at the next Court to be held at dividing Creek in and for the County aforesaid the third Tuesday of August then next following to answer unto the presentment aforesaid &c but for want thereof the said Francis Tate is Committed into the Custody of the Sheriffe of the County aforesaid there to remain until he be from thence be delivered by due Course of Law &c

At which said third Tuesday of August Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one at a Court then held at dividing Creek by his said Lordships Justices came the aforesaid Francis Tate in his proper person in Custody of the Sheriffe of the County aforesaid in whose Custody for the Cause aforesaid was Committed and being by the said Sheriffe Led to the barr. and had a hearing of the presentment
