

August Court 1741 - 169

Thereupon it is commanded the Sheriff of the County aforesaid that he should take the said Katherine Wileman if she to answer & aid now to witt at thid same Court held for the County aforesaid at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March being the seventeenth day of the same month anno Domini One Thousand seven hundred and forty above aforesaid before the aforesaid Justices came the aforesaid Katherine Wileman in her proper person according to a certaine Recognition by her and her security in that part first acknowledged and had ahearing of the Indictment and say that she is not guilty and of this she puts herself upon the Country and Robert Jenkins Henry Gentleman his Lordships attorney who for his said Lordship in this part followeth in like manner —

Thereupon command is given to the Sheriff of Sommerset County that he should cause to come here before his Lordships Justices at the next Court to be held at Dividing Creek in and for the County aforesaid the third Tuesday of June then next following twelve & by whom & and who neither to recognize her and the same day is given to the aforesaid Katherine here —

Whereupon came hereto court aforesaid John Wileman and Thomas Lunden of Sommerset County Gentleman and undertook for the same Katherine Wileman and acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Lordships the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary in ten pounds Sterling money each of their bodys goods or Chattels Lands or tenements severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors If it happen that the said Katherine Wileman do not make her personall appearance at the next Court to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June then next following to answer unto his said Lordship of the Indictment aforesaid and do not stay and abide the Judgment of the Court thereupon and do depart the same Court without leave and in the mean time if she be not of the good behaviour —

All which day here before his Lordships Justices came the aforesaid Katherine Wileman in her proper person according to a certaine Recognition by her and her security in this part first acknowledged as the aforesaid Robert Jenkins Henry Gentleman who for his said Lordship in this part presenteth and the Sheriff sends not thereof his witness —

Therefore as before it is commanded the aforesaid Sheriff that he should cause to come before his said Lordships Justices at the next Court to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August then next following twelve & to recognize in form aforesaid and the same day is given to the aforesaid Katherine here —

Whereupon came hereto Court the aforesaid John Wileman and Thomas Lunden of Sommerset County Gentleman and undertook for the said Katherine Wileman and acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary in ten pounds Sterling each of their bodys goods or Chattels Lands or tenements severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors If it happen that the said Katherine Wileman doe not make her personall appearance before his Lordships Justices at the next Court to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August then next following to answer unto his said Lordship of the Indictment aforesaid and do not stay and abide the Judgment of the Court thereupon and do depart the same Court without leave and in the mean time if she be not of the good behaviour —

All which day here before his Lordships Justices came the aforesaid Katherine Wileman in her proper person according to a certaine Recognition by her and her security in that part first acknowledged as the aforesaid Robert Jenkins Henry Gentleman his Lordships attorney who for his said Lordship in this part presenteth and the Jurors of that Jury by the Sheriff of the County aforesaid to this Impartiall to witt John Waters, William Turpin, Isaac Marshall, Jonathan Bound, Bowdine Robins, Samuel Jones, Joseph Tillman, Solomon Kitch, Joshua Sturgis, Thomas Beal, Peter Taylor, and John Addison —
