Somerset County March 4<sup>th</sup> 1739/40 Then came William Jones before me the subscriber one of  
his Lordships Justices of the peace for the said County and produced the above account in common form  
before Washills

All which day here came the afo<sup>r</sup> Francis Tate by Robert Jenkins Henry his attorney and  
the sheriff to will John Henry gent: now he returned that he had taken the afo<sup>r</sup> Francis Tate whose  
body hereat this day he had ready to answer the afo<sup>r</sup> William Jones of the afo<sup>r</sup> plea as to him it was so  
commanded and further the afo<sup>r</sup> Sheriff returned that he had served the afo<sup>r</sup> Francis with a copy of  
the declaration abovesaid according to act of assembly in such case provided &c.

Whereupon came hereinto Court a certain James Anderson and Abraham Heath in their  
proper persons and understood and each of them intended for the said Francis Tate (if he were  
the said Francis Tate present herein Court in his proper person assumed upon himself) that  
if it should happen that Judgment in the plea afo<sup>r</sup> should be rendered for the afo<sup>r</sup> William Jones against  
him the said Francis Tate or that the same Francis Tate should be therein found that then he  
the said Francis Tate should pay and satisfy unto the said William Jones the Judgment of  
the Court thereon or render his body in execution of such Judgment to the power of the sheriff of the  
County afo<sup>r</sup> in satisfaction thereof or that they the said James Anderson and Abraham Heath will do  
the same for him &c.

And the afo<sup>r</sup> Francis Tate by George Douglas his attorney cometh and defendeth  
the same and injury wherein &c and prayeth leave thereof to Imparte here until next Court to be held at  
Dividing Leake the third Tuesday of August then next following and he hath it and the same day is  
given to the afo<sup>r</sup> William Jones also &c

All which day here came againe as well the afo<sup>r</sup> William Jones as the afo<sup>r</sup> Francis Tate  
by their attorneys afo<sup>r</sup> and whereupon the same Francis as before defends the same and injury wherein &c  
and says that he did not assume upon himself in manner and form as the plaintiff afo<sup>r</sup> against  
him hath complained and of this reports himself upon the legittay &c and the afo<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> in like manner  
Therefore it is commanded the sheriff that immediately he should cause to come before his Lordship  
Justices
