Whereupon the said Attorney of the said Lord Proprietary for the same Lord Proprietary prayeth the Advice of the Court here in the premises and that due process of law in this part may be made against the said Thomas Singelly to answer unto the said Lord Proprietary of and upon the premises

Thereupon Command was given to the sheriffs of Somerset County that he should take the said Thomas Singelly if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should cause to keep so that he might have his body here immediately before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset now sitting at dividing Creek to answer unto his said Lordship of the Information aforesaid. And afterwards to wit the same day and year above mentioned came here before his Lordship Justice the said Thomas Singelly in his proper person and had a hearing of the Information aforesaid and saith that he cannot deny but that he is guilty of the premises aforesaid in the Information aforesaid specified above upon him imposed in manner and form as by the Information aforesaid above against him supposed. and the premises in the Information aforesaid expressly acknowledgeth . . . . .

Whereupon all and singular the premises being seen and by the Court here fully understood It is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Thomas Singelly pay unto his Lordship the right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of Maryland for his fines by the Court here upon him imposed for and by Occasion of the premises aforesaid whereof in form aforesaid he is convicted five shillings current money of Maryland and that the said Thomas Singelly be taken to satisfy his Lordship of the aforesaid fine. . . . . Whereupon the said Thomas Singelly is ordered to give good Security for the payment of all fees or fees due on the Information aforesaid to any person or persons whatsoever - Thereupon a certain Samuel Mills of Somerset County planter present herein Court in his proper person undertook for the said Thomas Singelly for the payment of all fees or fees due on the Information aforesaid to any person or persons whatsoever in case the said Thomas Singelly doth not pay the same &c. . . . .

Whereupon the said Thomas Singelly is ordered to give security for his good behaviour and appearance at November Court next. Thereupon the aforesaid Thomas Singelly with the aforesaid Samuel Mills of Somerset County planter his security both present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary in twenty pounds current money each of their bodies goods or Chattels Lands or Tenements severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors. If it happen that the said Thomas Singelly do not make his personal appearance at the next Court to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November then next following to answer unto

his
