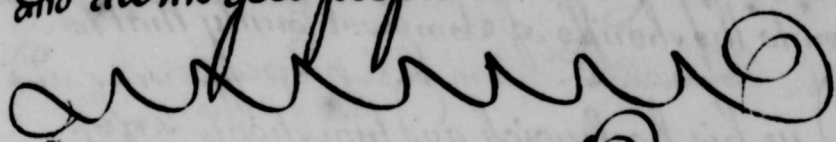

The same } And now to wit the Eighteenth day of August Anno Domini the thousand seven hundred and forty one at a Court then held at dividing Creek in and for the County of Somers. before his Lordships Justices came a certain George Taylor in his proper person according to a certain Recognizance by him and his security in that part first acknowledged and pray that his appearance may be recorded and he and his security accordingly discharged &c.

Thereupon the said George Taylor's appearance is recorded and he and his security discharged. Whereupon the said George Taylor is ordered to give new Recognizance for his appearance before his Lordships Justices at the next Court to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November then next following to answer unto such matters and things as should be then and there objected against him on his said Lordships behalf &c.

Thereupon the said George Taylor with Joseph Nicholson of Somerset County planter his security both present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Lordship the right Honourable the Lord Proprietary in twenty pounds Court money each of their bodies goods or chattels Lands or tenements severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordships his heirs and Successors if it happen that the said George Taylor does not make his personal appearance at the next to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November then next following to answer unto his said Lordship of all such matters and things as should be then and there objected against him on his said Lordships behalf and do not stand and abide the Judgment of the Court thereupon and do depart the same Court without leave and in the meantime if he be not of the good behaviour toward his said Lordship and all his good people &c. more especially toward Archibald McNeal &c.
