Whereupon the A<sup>d</sup>. John Caldwell put in his place William Arbuckles Gent. attorney at Law  
against the C<sup>t</sup>. Robert Givan off the A<sup>d</sup>. plea —

And thereupon at the Request of the parties A<sup>d</sup>. day is to them now here given  
until Court to be held at dividing Creek in and for the County of the third Tuesday of June then  
next following in the same state as at present saving to the parties A<sup>d</sup>. &c.

All which day here came again the parties A<sup>d</sup>. by their attorneys A<sup>d</sup>. and hereupon the  
said parties present herein Court in their proper persons submitted their disputes in this action to  
the Arbitrament of George Douglas, and William Arbuckles of Somerset County Gentlemen and  
it is agreed by and between the parties A<sup>d</sup>. that the afoe Arbitrators Return <sup>their</sup> Arbitrament  
in writing under their hands and seals to the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset  
to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August then next following that the same  
Justices may proceed thereon to Judgment against either of the parties A<sup>d</sup>. as if the same  
laws were determined by the same Court — and it is further agreed by and between the parties  
A<sup>d</sup>. that Submission be made a rule of this Court. Therefore it is ordered that the  
Submission A<sup>d</sup>. in manner and form A<sup>d</sup>. made according to the form and effect of the statute  
in that case made lately made and provided be entred and made a Rule of this Court on the motion  
of the parties A<sup>d</sup>. &c.

All which day here came again the said John Caldwell by his attorney A<sup>d</sup>. and hereupon the  
said Robert Givan altho' solemnly called came not nor is he with A<sup>d</sup>. against the A<sup>d</sup>. John Caldwell further pronounced  
Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Robert Givan's bond as A<sup>d</sup>.  
take nothing by his writ aforesaid but that he and his pledges of prosecuting be in mercy and that the same Robert.  
name. pledges and that the said John Caldwell goe thereof without day &c.
