Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Nathaniel Horsey late of Somerset County Mariner if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordship's County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one to satisfy Moses Chaille Junr. of Two pounds seventeen shillings and ten pence in Gold and nine hundred and twelve pounds of tobacco which to the same Moses Chaille in the same Court before his said Lordship's Justices adiring Creek were adjudged for his damages which he had by occasion of a certain promise and assumption to the same Moses Chaille by the afo<sup>r</sup> Nathaniel made and not performed whereof he is convict. And the same day is given to the afo<sup>r</sup> Moses

At which day here came the afo<sup>r</sup> Moses Chaille in his proper person and the sheriff to wit John Handly gent now here returned that he had taken the afo<sup>r</sup> Nathaniel Horsey whose body here at this day he had ready to satisfy the afo<sup>r</sup> Moses of the afo<sup>r</sup> damages afo<sup>r</sup> as to him it was commanded

Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take John Evans late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordship's County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one to satisfy Francis Allen twenty pounds Current money of Maryland and three hundred and Ninety three pounds of tobacco which to the said Francis in in the said Court before his Lordship's Justices were adjudged for his damages which he had by occasion of the speaking and divulging of a certain scandalous words of the afo<sup>r</sup> Francis by the afo<sup>r</sup> John Evans in the County afo<sup>r</sup> whereof he is convict.

At which day here came the afo<sup>r</sup> Francis Allen in his proper person and the sheriff to wit John Handly gent now here returned that he had taken the afo<sup>r</sup> John Evans whose body here at this day he had ready to satisfy the afo<sup>r</sup> Francis of the damages afo<sup>r</sup> as to him it was commanded

You John Evans Dan<sup>t</sup> Condry and John Evans P<sup>r</sup> doth confess Judgment to Francis Allen for the sum of three hundred ninety three pounds of tobacco which sum was recovered by the said Francis Allen against John Evans on the 28<sup>th</sup>
