William Willoughby James was Summoned to Answer unto Jacob Hindman and Thomas Stuart of a plea that he render unto them fifteen hundred and sixty pounds of tobacco which to them he owes and unjustly detains &c

And Whereupon the said Jacob and Thomas by Francis Allen their Attorney says that whereas the said William Willoughby James the ninth day of April Anno Dom one thousand seven hundred and forty at a certain place called Dorchester County to witt at the County of Somerset aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court by his certain writing obligatory which the said Jacob and Thomas with the seal of the said William Willoughby James signed hereinto Court bring the date whereof is the same day and year did promise to pay to the said Jacob Hindman and Thomas Stuart the aforesaid Sum of fifteen hundred and sixty pounds of tobacco it being for value received when he should be thereunto requested yett the said William Willoughby James tho: often requested
