Injury when &c. and prayeth leave thereof to Imparls here untill next Court to be held at dividing
trees the third Tuesday of June then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the As.
Edward here also &c.

At which day here came againe as well the As. Edward Beachamp as the
As. Barnall Niblett by their attorneys As. and hereupon the said Barnall Niblett as before, defendes the
force and Injury when &c. and saith that he is not guilty of the trespass in manner and form as the plaintiffs
above against him hath complained and of this he puts himself upon the Country &c.

And hereupon the As. Edward Beachamp pray leave thereof to Imparls here untill
next Court to be held at dividing trees in and for the County As. the third Tuesday of August ^{then next following} and he hath it and
the same day is given to the As. Barnall Niblett here also &c.

At which day here came againe as well the As. Edward Beachamp as the As.
Barnall Niblett by their attorney As. And whereupon the plaintiffs and defendant by their said
Attorneys submitted their dispute in this action to the arbitrament and final Determination of William
Arbuckle and Robert Jenkins Henry of Somerset County Gentleman and it is agreed by and between
the parties As. that the As. Arbitrators Return their Arbitrament in writing under their hands and seals
to the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing trees in and for the County
As. the third Tuesday of November then next following that the same Justices may proceed thereon
to Judgment against Either of the parties As. if the Cause were determined by the Court. And it is further
agreed by the parties As. that, that Submission As. be made a Rule of this Court Therefore it is
Ordered that the Submission As. in manner and form As. made according to the form and effect of
the statute in that Case lately made and provided be entred and made a Rule of this Court on the
motion of the parties As. and the same day is given to the parties As. here &c.
