And Whereupon the as^d Wilson M^r Dorman prays leave thereof to Importe here untill next Court to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November ^{then} next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the as^d Thomas Sanders here also &c

At which day here come again the as^d Wilson M^r Dorman in his proper person and the said Thomas Sanders altho^t solemnly called came not nor his writ as^d against the as^d Wilson M^r Dorman further proceeded &c

Therefore it is considered that the as^d Thomas Sanders take nothing by his writ as^d but be thereof in mercy for his false clamor and that the as^d Wilson go thereof without day &c

Command was given to the sheriffs of Somerset County that Wth A. Andrew Wilson he should take Andrew Wilson late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his barlywick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June Anno Dom^o one thousand seven hundred and forty one to answer unto Thomas Pollit of a plea wherefore with force and arms the loss of him the said Thomas at Somerset County as^d he did break and enter and five hundred oak Timber Trees and five hundred Pine Trees thereon lately growing he did cut down split into boards and fence Rails and the same did carry away to the value of thirty pounds and the soil thereof did dig up and plant and other Enormitys to him then and there did to the previous damage of the said Thomas and contrary to the peace &c And the same day is given to the as^d Thomas here &c

And hereupon the said Thomas Pollit complained of the as^d Andrew Wilson in the plea as^d in form following . . . Somerset s^t. Andrew Wilson late of Somerset County Planter was attached to answer unto Thomas Pollit of a plea wherefore with force and arms the loss of him the said Thomas at Somerset County as^d he did break and enter and five hundred oak Timber Trees and five hundred Pine Trees thereon lately growing he did cut down split into boards and fence Rails and the same did carry away to the value of thirty pounds and the soil thereof did dig up and plant and other Enormitys to him then and there did to the previous damage of the said Thomas and
