Sum Rated by the Justices at Twelve Shilling and Six pence of Gallon and so pro rata for a greater or lesser quantity and all other Expenses and Ordinarily expenses Rated as usual &c

All a Court held at dividing Creek by Cap^t John Hardy high Sheriff of Somerset County together with the worshipfull John Scot George Dashiell Thomas Gillispie and Matthew Dashiell Gent^l his Lordships Justice in the County Court on the twenty eighth day of October anno. Dom^o 1741 and did then and there pursuant to his said Lordships writ of Election set at about, and did cause publick proclamation to be made during the sitting of the same Court, in Common form, that the day for the Election for Burgesses should be on the Monday the sixteenth day of November then next following at dividing Creek in and for the County of Somerset which time and place the Court is adjourned unto &c

All which day came againe the said Sheriff with Cap^t Robert King Cap^t John Scot Cap^t James and several other Justices, and the Clerk of the County Court, and the Court being called in Common form the several freeholders did then and there elect and chose Mr. William Thoughton Cap^t Robert King Major Geo: Gale and Cap^t James Martin Gent^l as Burgesses for the County of Somerset to serve in the next Generall assembly at the City of Annapolis &c

The Court adjourns untill the third Tuesday of March anno. Dom^o 1741
